Over the past two centuries our congregation has changed, but our mission remains the same: to make disciples of Jesus Christ. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.

We will be celebrating World Communion Sunday with participants in worship from REACH International, our international student ministry. During our service the communion liturgy will be read in several different languages and prayers in worship will be from around the world.
